

We will continue our work on courageous advocacy this academic year and as a starting point, we plan to raise awareness and support for Air Ambulance UK. Attendance and Punctuality

As you will be aware from previous correspondence, there is now new statutory guidance on improving school attendance. As a Federation, we are currently updating our attendance policy to reflect these changes and we will send this out to you soon.

As a school, we are always focused on good to high levels of attendance and we monitor this closely.

Where there are barriers, our role is to support families so that children can continue to make progress and secure good outcomes. We will work with you and our inclusion officer to help achieve this goal.

Support given for barriers to attendance do not include term time holidays. Term time holidays have become an increasingly common problem for many schools and we are no different. Until now, we have not issued fines for taking a term time holiday. However, under the new guidance, we will now be reviewing this and should we not see any improvements, we will have no choice but to issue fines. Further information on this will follow.

You may find the visuals provided below incredibly useful in highlighting the lost learning and social opportunities that lateness and less than good levels of attendance, can have.

The importance of arriving at school on time

If your child is 5 minutes late they lose	25 minutes a week	1 hour 40 minutes a month	2 hours 30 minutes a half term	5 hours a term This is equivalent to over 1 full day	16 hours 15 minutes a school year This is equivalent to over 3 days
If your child is 10 minutes late they lose	50 minutes a week	3 hours 20 minutes a month	5 hours a half term This is equivalent to 1 full day	10 hours a term This is equivalent to 2 full days	32 hours 30 minutes a school year This is equivalent to over 6 full days
